Overview

Situated at the mouth of the picturesque Roseway River, and opposite the historic Town of Shelburne, the park's scenic coastal setting provides opportunities for camping, picnicking and boating.

62 campsites, open for camping from June to October

Protection Values

Two species of vascular plant found within the park are classed as imperiled.

Education Values

Regional and locally significant interpretive site with ties to regional history.

Tourism Values

Regional and locally significant tourism site, with a rich historic and cultural past. Proximity to abandoned rail corridor and Town of Shelburne, community events.

Outdoor Recreation Values

Camping, picnicking, boat launch, shoreline access, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing.
