- Safety Studies Hwy 101, 103, 104, 105
- Highway feasibility Reports by CBCL
 - Phase One Report released July 2016
 - Final Report January 2017
- Consultations (Jan. 30 to Mar. 9, 2017)
 - 14 public meetings plus one stakeholder session attended by 1,900 people
 - 5,400 pieces of feedback through the website
- What We Heard document



What We Heard

- Overall themes:
 - Road improvements
 - Cost of toll on communities
 - Other options to improve safety
 - Share in cost




Government's Commitment

- Proceed without tolling
- Twin 3 sections:
 - HWY 101: Windsor Causeway (9.5 km)
 - HWY103: Tantallon to Hubbards (22 km)
 - HWY 104: Sutherlands River to Antigonish (38 km)
- Construct the Burnside Connector new, four lane divided highway from Burnside to Bedford (8.7 km)
- Increase capital budget by \$390M, spread over next 7 years
- \$390M includes \$30M in safety improvements




Highway 101 Three Mile Plains to Falmouth






Highway 103 Upper Tantallon to Hubbards






Highway 104 Sutherlands River to Antigonish

New Safety Investment

- \$30M over 7 years to address safety issues on 100 series highways not being twinned.
- Examples
 - Improving at grade intersections
 - Adding passing and climbing lanes
 - Adding turning lanes
- In-depth safety study on HWY 107



Next Steps

- Fast track submissions to Federal Government
- Safety review on 107 beginning this year
- Continue with safety improvements at accelerated pace
- Remove toll for NS motorists on Cob Pass when bonds are paid.
